


EVERY DAY

## PRENATAL CARE

If mothers receive prenatal care, their children are more likely to adopt healthy behaviors.





## PRESCHOOL

Low-income children who participate in preschool are more likely to graduate from high school and earn better wages as adults, and less likely to end up in jail.

## 3RD-GRADE READING

Students who can read at grade level in third grade are four times more likely to graduate on time than those who can't.





## NUTRITION

Children who receive proper nutrition have higher IQs and fewer behavioral problems.

Meaning they live at or near the poverty level, and may not have access to healthy food outside of school.

## SIXTH-GRADE MATH

If students who've fallen behind in school don't catch up by sixth grade, their chance of dropping out of high school jumps to 75 percent.

## HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION

People with a high school diploma earn \$8,000 a year more than their peers who didn't graduate.
