Interest in this session?

Devin – put together the state's housing needs assessment. Interactive version with tableau.

Katie – recently did two housing needs assessments in charlotte

Sarah – eviction, zoning, housing profiles – interested in doing more

Laura- pulling together what's in public data sets, appraisal district just sent us all their stuff. Would like to get more into housing.

Kathy Perez- community advisor for USC, and direct service provider

Leah –collecting info on housing production/preservation for the region.

**Topic: Evictions** 

Mike – just wrapped up a project for Legal Aid of Cleveland – access to safe decent affordable housing options in the places people are getting evicted at high rates – related to lead work – access to adequate homes.

Katie – did a 3 part report. on evictions in 2018. w

Sarah – eviction filings –worked with CT Fair Housing Center – update weekly, monthly, report – did imputation on, looked at disparities – outcomes and filings. Info from what we learned was included in the legislation for right to counsel. Haven't done a lot of outreach to legal services providers. Want to reduce evictions. Not sure what the impact is.

Devin – state supreme court of ohio – good dashboard on number of evictions, down to municipal court. Some courts are a lot slower to report.

Laura – didn't think Eviction lab number is right for San Antonio. New group – Texas Housers putting out data- Bexar county is slower. Want to see if we can get a handle on the informal evictions.

Leah – in DC supporting cross-sector Eviction Prevention group (limited data work there), imputing race/ethnicity on eviction records in Cleveland – validating with CWRU CHILD data base. Would love to expand this work to other NNIP cities – particularly with more Latino populations. Also mention – Durham – DataWorks NC recently linked voter registration and evictions to look at racial disparities in evictions – report should be coming out soon.

Caroline – Ellis act evictions – CA policies – intended for small landlords – rent control prevents from eviction – so use Ellis Act provision to go out of business. Looking at those properties – and trajectory. – indicator law is being missed used. Possibly partner with other CA folks.

**Topic: Institutional investors** 

Mike - As part of lead poisoning research – id rental universe – try to find as many linkages to get a handle on the universe of landlords – basic name cleaning – 45000 unique owner names, compare names, tax mailing address- 36000 unique. Could map ownership and characterize landlords. Tax delinquency. Going to bring in plaintiffs. Report out in January.

Katie – focused – on identifying big players, but also looked at local players at low end of the market. Interesting to compare about age of housing stock and how investors are investing.

Sarah – looked at who is largest evictor – public housing authority. Not doing the thing designed to do (house people with low incomes).

Topic: Equitable development

Leah – Colleague Peter Tatian has done a lot of work on this with the 11<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge Park Project (panel from last NNIP meeting.) Also evaluated the Purple Line efforts on retaining small businesses and preserving affordable housing along new light rail line in suburban Maryland.

Sarah – important topic in community.

Katie – city of charlotte -maybe- harder for us at UNCC to have impact.

## **Topic Homelessness:**

Devin – get HMIS data from all the Continuums of care (CoC's) across the state – work with OSU link it to mental health, job and family services, in theory for research – to give back to the CoC – people were jumping from one place to another, a lot of entry and exits.

Mike – doing youth homelessness – difficult to track them.

Katie – county is doing the annual housing and homelessness report – HMIS and coordinated entry.

Laura – sit on the data committee for HMIS and CoC agency – used for local language access report and has a lot of info on type of disability.

Devin – different definition of homelessness – some people think should use the mckinney vento definition.

Leah – Urban colleagues putting out a report on housing instability on DC based on representative survey (11/16).

Laura - FHQC collect housing insecurity data.

Devin – looked at severe threshold for cost burden. Looking at number of people living in households like that – include race/sex, age.

Laura – data support for Promise – middle school was right across from one of the old public housing Choice redevelopment, when they tore it down the middle school emptied out – way more people living in Wheatly Courts than expected. Admin sources – that many kids with a shared unit address.

**Topic: Housing Quality** 

Laura -can we do a better job of housing quality? Registry of the most severe housing condition violators – marry health and housing .- ripe interest section on health and housing

Mike – Rohan in Milwaukee mentioned – internal survey of rental properties – property conditions and lead poisoning. City of Cleveland – does external conditions survey.

Sarah- used PLACES data -connected code violations, foreclosures, and evictions – would like to do more like that- data walk with it. Also 211 data.

## Other Topics:

Caroline – anything – moved to the center for real estate, housing conditions and housing markets. – could leverage expertise.

Laura -tangled title issue? half the people applying for help with repairs aren't eligible without title. Can take years – is there some way to buy properties – for getting housing out of that mess.

Detroit did this – death data you can ping – names against to try to figure out where titles are held by people who are dead. Relatively cheap.
