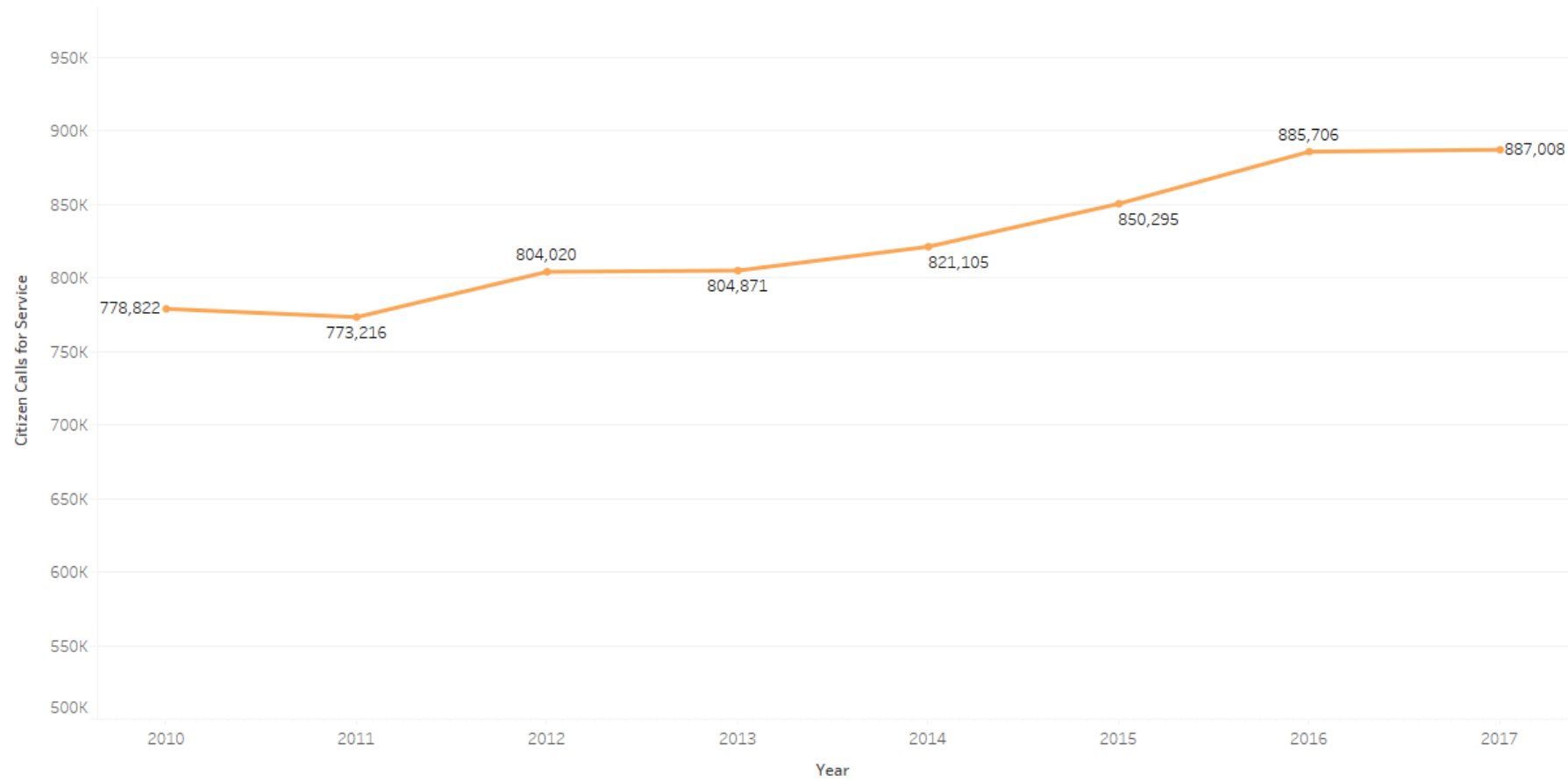

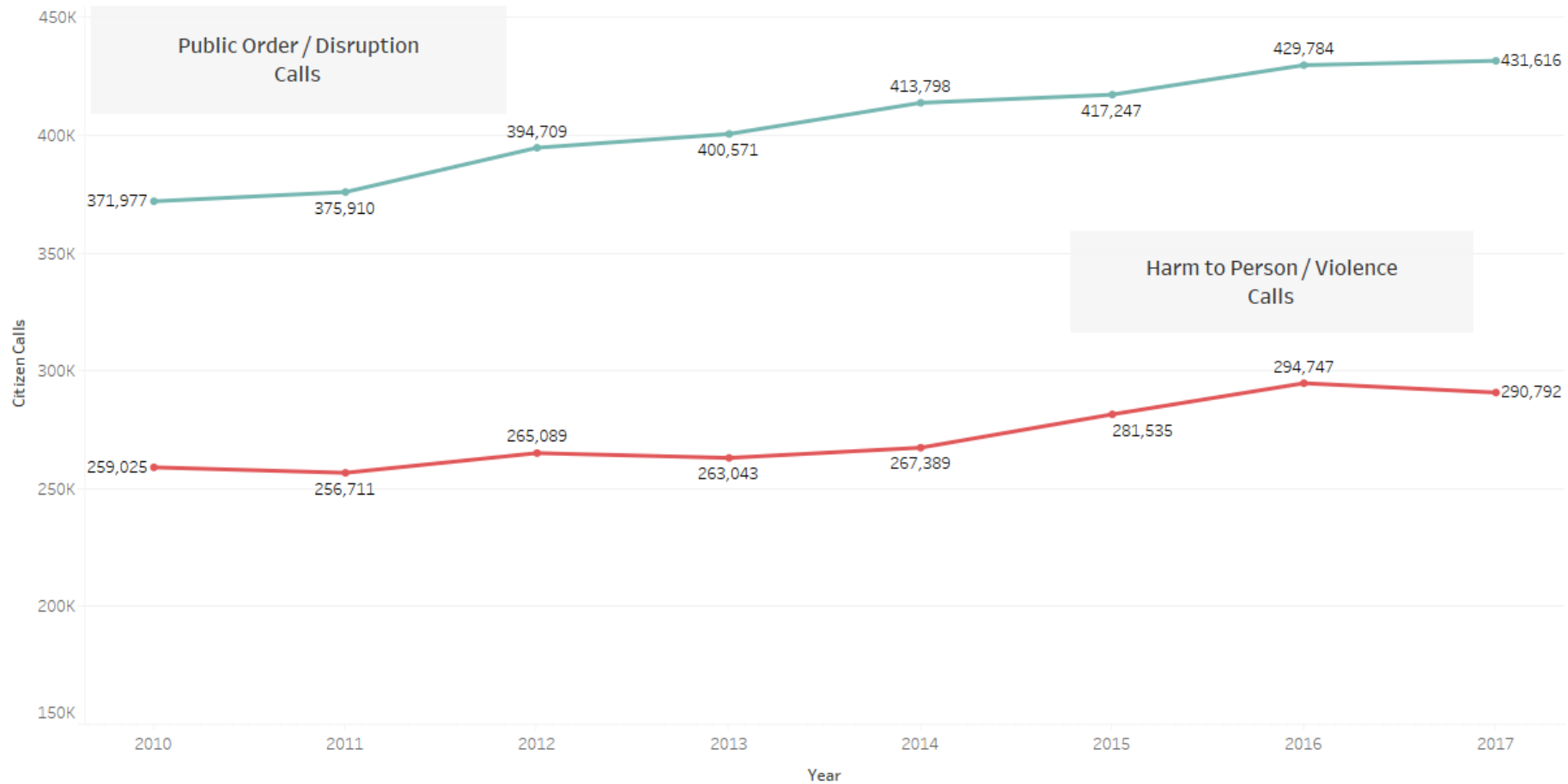
Citizen Calls for Service
