What is the Memphis Property Hub?

BACKGROUND: Established by Innovate Memphis in partnership with Neighborhood Preservation, Inc. & University of Memphis in 2015.

- Created to support local neighborhood advocacy and property blight remediation efforts.
- Public tool to share parcel-level data with government, education and non-profit partners in Memphis.
- •User interface and data visualization: the first version (MPH 1.0) was a flat data table, available for export and querying. In 2017, the data was able to visualized on a map using PolicyMap, which also contained data from national sources. Mapping only extending to census tract granularity. Now, with LandGrid, the visualization will improve on the user experience and be more actionable, in part because parcel-by-parcel mapping is possible.

TODAY:

Innovate Memphis, in partnership with the University of Memphis CAESER, manages the data sharing and maintenance to upload the data into the platform.

Innovate Memphis has moved the Memphis Property Hub to Land Grid, created by Loveland Technologies, so that you may be able to access parcel-level Memphis property data in one comprehensive, easy-to-use platform. The agreement also delivers surveying capability, which is shared with non-profits and CDCs.






Memphis Property Hub on Land Grid

- Parcel level polygons for property condition tied to the parcel-level (not just points on a map)
- More advanced data queries including dynamic layers of local Memphis data
- Embedded dynamic neighborhood boundaries
- Ability to draw custom boundaries
- Easy to use data upload and download capability, including built-in address geocoder
- Neighborhood Surveying Tool




Parcel Level Example














NEIGHBORHOOD PROFILE | Land Use


