Challenge: Difficulty Assessing State of Domestic Violence in Marion County, IN

- 1. Lack of Data about Domestic Violence
 - 2011 reports from 211 calls and limited data from prosecutor's office (protective orders)

- 2. What can we learn from the integrated data?










Matching and De-duplicating List of People





PERPETRATORS BY GENDER












Where Does Domestic Violence Occur?

The Julian Center analyzes police reports, determines incidents that are domestic violence cases, and reaches out to the victims of those cases. This map is based on the home location of those victims. Home addresses are mapped to a census tract. Data is displayed as a rate, based on the population of each census tract. This only includes victims from incidents that were reported to the police.







NUMBER OF REFERRALS BY TYPE OF NEED FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CALLERS










How DV Cases Progress Through Court

Targeted Initiatives – Do they Work? Baker One Initiative


- 1. IMPD Program that targets high-risk perpetrators and collects special data for cases where domestic violence is suspected.
- 2. List maintained of high-risk offenders
- 3. Electronic data collection began in 2013
- 4. Collected information on 2,716 DV cases in 2013 and 4,805 in 2016 (data collection increased 77%)








Baker One – Lethality Factors
