Best practice is school-based or w/in 1/2 mile

- Coverage of afterschool hours (M-F 3-6)

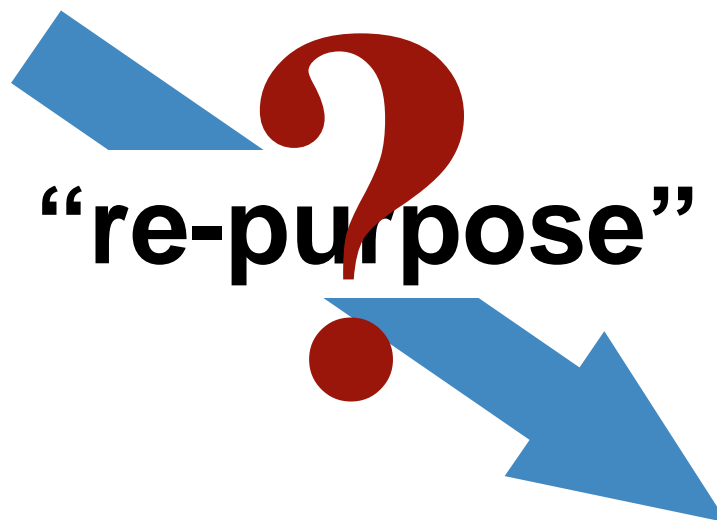



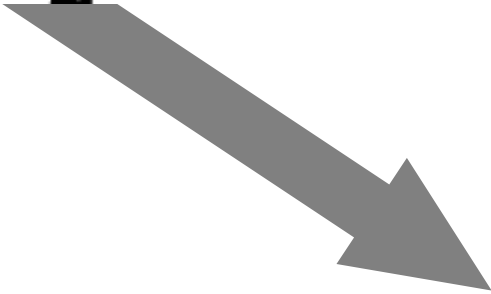

The contents of a resource database can be made available to the community through a number of products that may include:

- Print directories.
- Online databases hosted on searchable Web sites.
- Specialized directories for specific target populations or geographic areas.
- Brochures, flyers and information cards containing lists of services.
- Mailing labels and e-mail lists for other organizations to use when disseminating their own information.
-  Asset maps (e.g., maps indicating the locations of food pantries that planners can overlay with service request information and/or demographic data on low income families to illustrate gaps or overlaps in service).

- Red Cross will no longer have any fixed sites in Orleans Parish as of Dec. 1, 2005. Mobile Bulk Distribution and Mobile Feeding sites will retain previous capacities and carry out all activities on a roaming status
- December 15, 2005 is the last date for uptown debris removal below St. Charles
- Hazardous Household waste collection at Samuel Square on Napoleon and Saratoga on December 3rd and 4th from 9am – 4pm
- NOFD are now experiencing water pressure in areas that they were previously unable to access in the lower 9th Ward
- Salvation Army Katrina recovery center opening at 100 Jefferson HWY for social services. Ph # 504-835-7220 by appointment only
- FEMA will stop direct pay to hotels on Dec. 15. An additional extension for LA is in works
- RTA will begin New Orleans East service starting Sunday, December 4, 2005
- FEMA reports there are 478 families residing in travel trailers throughout the city
- Eleanor McMain High School opening January 9th open enrollment 7th-12th grade

- Emergency Rooms reporting a 3 – 4 hour waiting period across some New Orleans Metro Hospitals (New Orleans EOC Daily Brief – 12-02-05)
- Heart to Heart International has moved to the intersection of Caffin and N. Claiborne in coordination with the opening of the 9th Ward
- Ambulatory Clinic groups are moving forward with the delegation of coverage area responsibilities across Orleans Parish
- Area Ambulatory Clinics awaiting approval of Orleans Parish Action Request Forms for incorporation of services such as lab work and temporary facilities for additional clinics

People living below twice the poverty threshold per square mile by Census block group in Orleans Parish





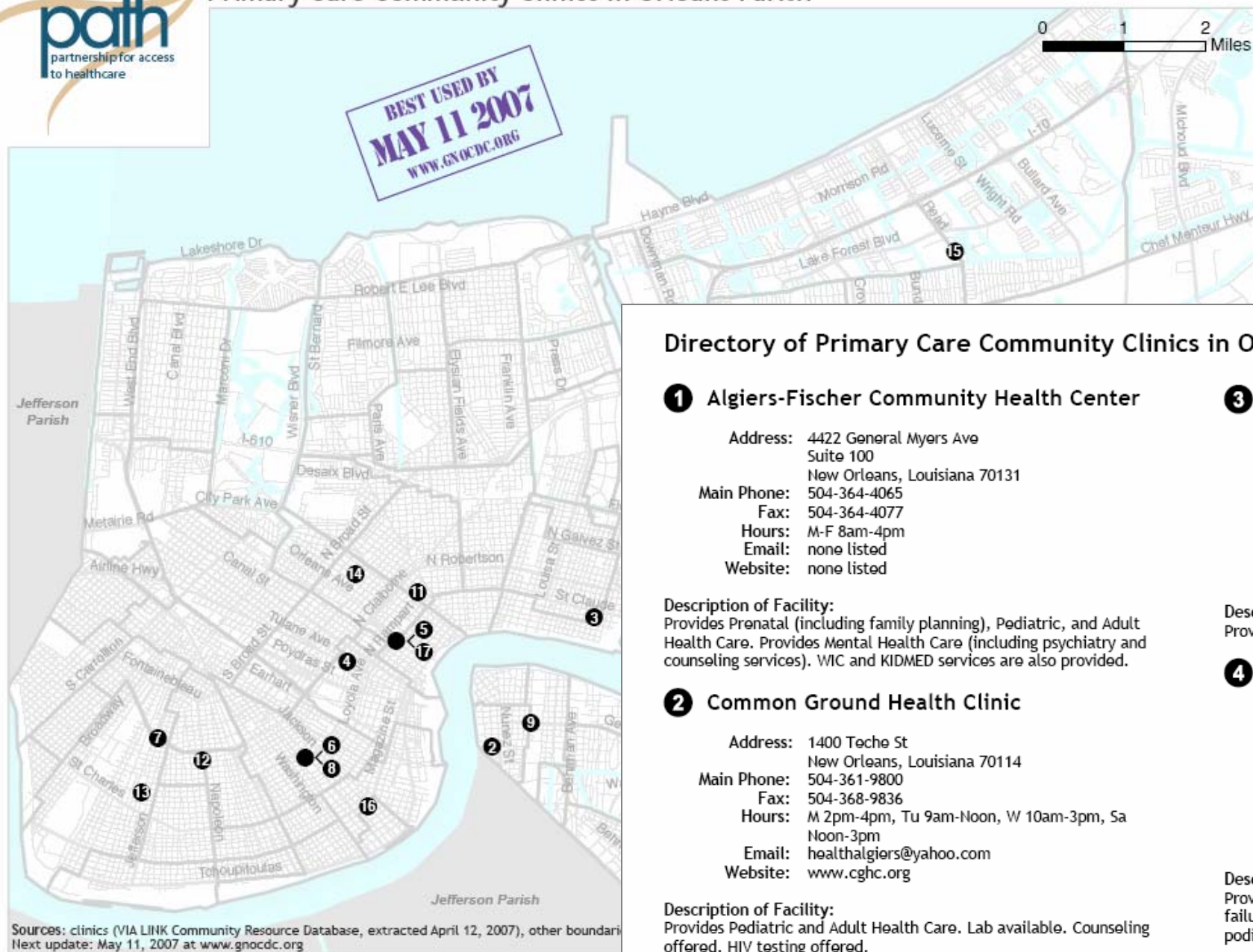

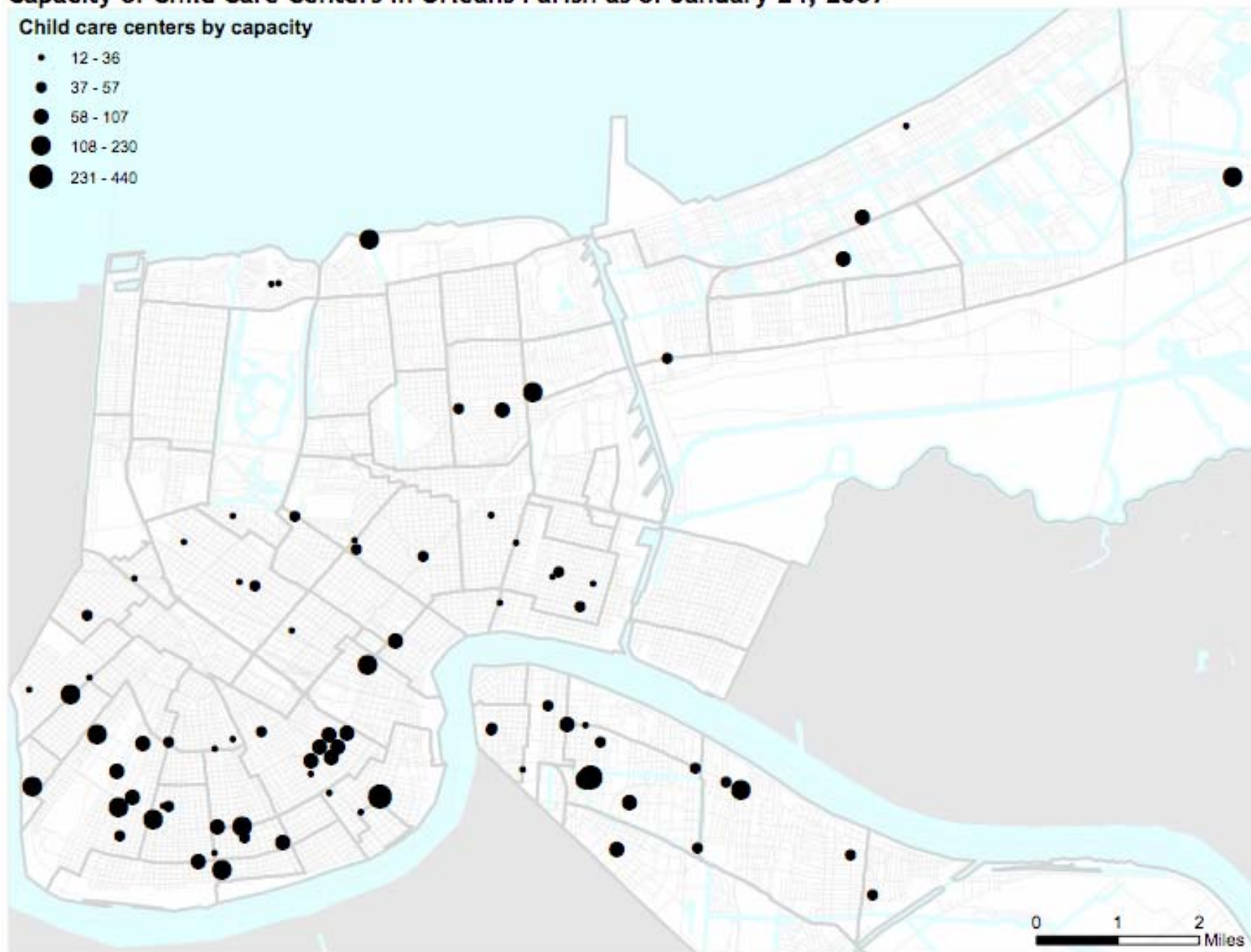
Child Care Centers in Orleans Parish as of January 24, 2007
