NNIP Partners:

NNIP members of the Open Indicators Consortium met for a day before the Providence meeting to work on our plans for further development and use of the Weave open source data visualization platform (see www.oicweave.org).

We reviewed a number of new features in development including enhanced performance with large data sets; real time collaboration in the software across users; and expanded analysis tools and capabilities, including integration with R statistical analysis software.

We invite you to explore what each of us is doing in Weave and what it would take to install and use Weave for your work. Soon we will be releasing “Simple Weave” which will enable organizations without access to specialized server support to install and run Weave. We are also exploring other ways to make Weave more accessible to all organizations.
